Keeping you motoring

Skoda Citigo Colour Edition - 1.0 Mpi 60PS



Skoda has always put value for money at the forefront in everything they do, and in keeping with that, the Skoda Citigo is a small, value for money, city-friendly hatchback that is actually more sophisticated than most of its rivals and at a price that most of us looking for a small family car can easily afford.

Power and Efficiency

The Citigo I had on test had been fitted with a 1.0 MPi 60PS engine and is one of the best non turbo units I have come across in recent years. Fuel consumption is around the 60mpg if you drive it without pushing too hard, and flat out you can expect to achieve a max speed of around 100mph and 0-62 time of around14sec.

I know what you are all thinking though - is it slow? Well actually it nips around really well and it does not feel underpowered at all even with only 60PS.

On the Road

The little Citigo is a scream – it's easy to drive and feels brilliant for such a small car, but you do need to remember this is not a race car; it's an eco warrior that was designed to save you money as well as look good and trendy. As for the handling - I would give it five stars because it's as good as the competition when the road gets twisty. Also, it's actually very quiet and quite refined, whilst the ride is a little bouncy, it's pretty decent really thanks mainly to Skoda doing a pretty good job on the suspension setup.

Safety and Technology

The safety side of the Citigo Is impressive too – with standard equipment like: ABS (Anti-lock Braking System), Driver's and front passenger's airbags and ESC (Electronic Stability Control).

alloy wheels, electric front windows, front fog lamps, manual air-conditioning, AM/FM radio including colour display with aux-in and SD card, USB ports, six speakers and Bluetooth, rear seat backrest split 60/40, remote central locking and sunset glass.

To Sum Up

The little Citigo - it's a great little car for doing the school run and for all the times when you need to nip into town to do a little retail therapy. There is no doubt in my mind that Citigo will live with you for a very long time and you will instantly replace it with another when the time is right. To be honest it's like your secret little friend that will make you feel happy every time you turn the key to go off on another little adventure.

The Viking, West Kirby



Frankby - "Hill Bark" - Stapledon Wood - Caldy - The Wirral Way - West Kirby Old Village - Larton - Royden Park - Frankby.
Walking distance (6 miles).

This is a lovely walk passing 2 impressive mansions, 2 quiet villages and beautiful

views of the Dee Estuary.

Parking at Royden Park, turn left into the driveway leading to "Hill Bark". Ignore the

Now turn left into the trees, following the broad path into a picnic area. Go straight across into the trees opposite and drop down into a wide grassland. Crossing this area you will have a lovely view of the mansion on your right.

Amazingly, "Hill Bark" once stood near the top of Bidston Hill (known as Bidston Court then). In This is a lovely walk passing 2 impressive mansions, 2 quiet villages and beautiful views of the Dee Estuary.

Parking at Royden Park, turn left into the driveway leading to "Hill Bark". Ignore the path leading off left to Thursaston Common, continuing forward towards the gates of the Hall for a further 30 yards.

Now turn left into the trees, following the broad path into a picnic area. Go straight across into the trees opposite and drop down into a wide grassland. Crossing this area you will have a lovely view of the mansion on your right.

Amazingly, "Hill Bark" once stood near the top of Bidston Hill (known as Bidston Court then). In 1930, Sir Ernest Royden acquired the property and had the Hall carefully taken down - each beam and stone being carefully numbered - and re-erected where you see it today!

Walking diagonally left (towards the trees) you will arrive at a tumbledown sandstone wall, do not cross but keep it on your left until you reach a wooden bachelor gate. Pass through, turn to the right and a short walk will bring you to Montgomery Hill. Go straight across the road and enter the broad sandy track opposite. This will take you through fields to the West Kirby-Heswall Road, where you turn right. Follow the road for a quarter of a mile, until you reach Grange Cross Lane, go straight across and follow the road uphill for 200 yards. Cross the road to a gap in the wall and flight of stone steps, this is the way into Stapleton Woods.

As you enter the woods, take the left fork of the path. Keep the old stone wall (what is left of it) on your left as you go forward. After about 10 minutes, you will arrive at steps which take you down to a path passing behind some houses. You very soon reach a wooden bachelor gate which brings you into Caldy Road. Here, your way is to the right following the windy road through Caldy Village.

Caldy, mentioned in the Doomesday Book as Calders, was described in the early part of the 19th Century as being "one of the worst villages in Wirral, consisting of a few fishermen's huts and miserable hovels." Fortunately, R W Barton changed all this when he bought the village and either rebuilt or renovated every house! What a beautiful village it is today!

Following Caldy Road as it bears to the right at the church, look out for a stone memorial in front of the church. Now cross the road to enter a path facing the

memorial. This path narrows to become a sandy track winding its way down to Croft Drive. Here you need to turn right, crossing Croft Drive West and carry on forward to reach the remains of a demolished railway bridge. Turn right here into Wirral Country Park. Follow the Wirral Way for 3/4 of a mile with the Dee on your left. Look ahead for a bridge and climb the steps on the right when you reach it, leading into York Avenue.

Now go forward into the old village of West Kirby, passing 2 Inns, the Moby Dick and the Ring O'Bells, following the road as it climbs towards Grange Beacon, a popular viewing beacon. To reach the Beacon, look right for some stone steps as you near the top of the road. Climb the steps and they take you to the column. There is a lovely view of West Kirby and Hilbre Island, then turn left along Column Road. When you reach the crossroads, turn right down Blackhorse Hill to reach the The Viking with a great selection of bar food at reasonable costs to enjoy. From The Viking, turn left and at the bottom of the hill cross into Saughall Massie Road. You will pass a school and then the lane winds it's way between fields to meet a lane signposted "Frankby". Turn right here and, when you reach China Farm on the left of the road, pass this farmhouse and turn left into the field. Cross diagonally right over the field, ignoring the farm track which follows the left hedge. Walk towards a small group of trees, you are now on your way to Larton, After you have crossed a two-bar stile, continue forward over a step-stile and a small stone footbridge until, after leaving the trees, you reach Larton Stables. The path now becomes a wide track following a straight line to reach Frankby Road. Carry on straight ahead through a bachelor gate, following a well-trodden pathway that rises as it passes close to Frankby Hall. This building was built in 1846 by Sir Thomas Royden, 80 years ago the Hall and it's 61 acre estate was offered to Hoylake Council for £8,000! As they weren't interested, Wallasey Corporation bought the estate for use as a cemetery and the Hall is now a chapel. The path passes the Hall, carrying on straight ahead to end at the bachelor gate where it meets Montgomery Hill. Turn right, follow the road for about 100 yards and then turn left into a broad tree lined road that will take you back to the car park.

August in the Garden

For many gardeners the month of August begins the downhill slide into off season. Warm climate gardeners have a second chance, but some don't have a second wind after summer's heat. Your garden is hardier than you think and there are plenty of gardening tasks for August that will keep your flower and vegetable gardens going longer, as well as opportunities to get a head start on next year's garden plans.

Here's a Garden-To-Do List for the sultry month of August:

- Seed a fall crop of peas and spinach and keep harvesting. There's always something to make with zucchini.
- Pick herbs for fresh use and for drying.
 Harvesting will keep them growing longer.
- Order spring bulbs for planting and forcing.
- Check that your mulch hasn't decomposed and add more as needed.
- Spread a mid-season layer of compost or manure.
- Keep deadheading and harvesting.
- Leave some annual seeds to self-sow.
- Start saving seeds and taking cuttings.
- Remove any diseased foliage now, so it doesn't get lost in the fall leaves.
- Cut back the foliage of early bloomers

- like Brunnera and hardy geraniums, to revitalize the plants.
- Prune summer flowering shrubs as the flowers fade.
- Trim and feed handing baskets to prolong their beauty.
- Take pictures of your garden at peak.
- Pot up perennial divisions for spring plant swaps. Sink the pots into the ground this fall and they'll be one less chore in the spring.
- Plant trees, shrubs and perennials now, so they can take root, and keep them well watered.
- Get your fall-blooming crocus and colchicum planted so they'll bloom on time.
- Start moving houseplants back indoors, so they get used to the limited sun exposure and humidity. Maybe bring some outdoor plants inside, to over winter, too.







BUSINESSES ASKED TO HELP KEEP BEACHES & SEAS CLEAN



There are over 25 dedicated beach clean groups spread across the North West coast volunteering their time to help reduce litter on the beach and in the sea.

Although volunteering their time to help on a beach clean may be a stretch for many people, much can be done within the community to prevent pollution reaching the natural environment in the first place.

That's why LOVEmyBEACH have developed a beach friendly checklist for business owners, offering advice on how improvements can be made to prevent pollution.

Simple steps such as disposing of kitchen fats in the bin rather than down the sink, putting stickers on your toilets asking people to put disposable products in the bin and not the toilet, or becoming a ReFILL station to cut back on the requirement for single-use water bottles, can all help make a difference.

Kate Shane, Head of Merlin Entertainments' Blackpool Cluster has recently signed up to be a **LOVEmyBEACH** business and as a

result is promoted the '3Ps' initiative in all of the venues toilet facilities in order to avoid environmentally-damaging items ending up in marine waters or washed up on the beach.

She added: "This is an incredibly important campaign. When people flush the wrong things down the toilet it significantly increases the risk of sewage and unflushable items leaking into the sea which can cause problems for wildlife and also make people ill if they are swimming or paddling."

The checklist is a simple A4 sheet which a business owner or manager could complete in less than half an hour. It also includes an employee pledge sheet; encouraging businesses to speak to their teams about the actions which individuals can take at work and at home to protect our coastline.

The business checklist can be found on the LOVEmyBEACH website. The site also contains information about beach clean events across the North West coast for those businesses who want to go the extra mile.

Glyn takes on the Stelvio Pass for Maggie's









Wirral man Glyn Salmon has just returned having completed the Stelvio Pass in Italy with his friend Graham Hanna on behalf of Maggie's Merseyside, raising close to £4,000 for the cancer caring Centre located next to The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre.

Glyn and Graham completed the 21km Stelvio pass, which is 21km long with an average gradient of 7% with the summit approx. 10,000 ft above sea level. Glyn said "I have had two bouts of cancer. The first time 4 years ago I had a small operation followed by chemotherapy and radiotherapy, sadly two years late the cancer returned and I had an 11 hour operation followed by a six hour operation four months later. The operations have left me with a permanent soma and rare condition called Pudendal Neuropathy / neve entrapment leaving me with chronic pain and the inability to sit down.

The disease prevents me from the doing the thing I loved best (once the football went) cycling, so I have adapted and for the past year I have been riding my recumbent trike. This is not a message of pity but a message of hope for people who have to or are dealing with this terrible disease, please just keep going, find ways of adapting and draw on the tremendous love that your beautiful family and friends give you."

Glyn and Graham have raised close to £4,000 for the Maggie's Centre, following the support Glyn received there. Glyn now volunteers at the Centre, welcoming Centre visitors as they call in for support.

He continued, "The love and support I got from my family and friends helped me to get back on my feet, but life was never going to be the same and the mental side of my cancer

and my operations was becoming a block in recovering to lead a decent life again. My doctor asked me to go to Maggie's and see the counsellor.

I walked into this beautiful building by the side of the cancer unit at Clatterbridge hospital, to welcome of warmth and understanding. Kathy and her wonderful team offer any amount of help and advice, with a wonderful smile.

It is here in Maggies you feel someone is listening to the pain you are in. It is a place where you can open your heart, you can cry, you do laugh and you do make friends".

Kathy Wright Centre Head at Maggie's said "We're all blown away by what Glyn and Graham have done for our Centre, and are completely humbled and inspired. Congratulations! Not only have they taken on an incredible challenge, having overcome countless barriers to making it up the pass, but they've raised such a huge amount of money. 



Bake 40 to 45 minutes or until apples are tender and crust is golden brown. Cover edge of crust with 2 - to 3-inch-wide strips of foil after first 15 to 20 minutes of baking to prevent excessive browning. Cool on cooling rack at least 2 hours before serving.



Fresh Berry Cream Tart

8 servings

Prep time: 15 minutes

Start to finish: 2 hours 55 minutes

Crus

1 Pillsbury refrigerated pie crust (from 14.1-ounce box), softened as directed on box

Filling

1 8-ounce package cream cheese, softened 1/3 cup sugar

1 tablespoon orange-flavored liqueur or orange juice

4 cups assorted fresh whole berries (small strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, and/or blackberries)

1/3 cup red currant jelly, melted

Heat oven to 450°F. Prepare pie crust as directed on package for one-crust baked shell using 9-inch tart pan with removable bottom. Bake for 9 to 11 minutes or until light golden brown. Cool completely.

In small bowl, combine cream cheese, sugar and liqueur; beat until smooth and well blended. Spread cream cheese mixture evenly in cooled baked shell. Top with berries; brush berries with melted jelly to glaze. Refrigerate at least 2 hours before serving. Store in refrigerator.

Rotarians were both moved and amazed to hear what was just a glimpse at what prisoners had to endure, especially those who had been injured or developed myriad illnesses due to the conditions of their imprisonment. At great risk, some prisoners used an array of means to record the conditions, while skilled craftsmen among them made medical instruments and equipment used to treat the survivors.

The subject will inspire a major art exhibition in 2019 headed up by The Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine, in partnership with the University of Liverpool. It will be held at the Victoria Gallery & Museum, Brownlow Hill, Liverpool, from October 2019 to June 2020.

Meg, whose Father Captain AA Duncan was himself a Japanese prisoner of war, has written a number of books and carried out extensive research, including recording the memories of 67 Far East prisoners of war. These men's stories had remained largely unheard — until this important project was undertaken.
